Generally, each speaker will give three 25 minute presentations with a 15 minute break between to allow you to walk to another session or spend time in the commons area. Please be on time, as it is very disruptive for speakers and the audience when people are coming in and out during sessions.

Session 3: 8.20- 8.45pm

**If the session is full there will be an opportunity to attend the next one as the content will be the same for each of the three sessions.**

The displays in the commons areas will be staffed, so you can ask questions about courses, entry requirements, accommodation and anything else you wish to know.

All senior students, especially Year 12 students are expected to be present, as there are some important decisions to be made. Subject selection for Year 13 is one of these.

Junior students are also very welcome and of course, parents. It does give parents the opportunity to find out firsthand about courses offered, subject requirements, fees and any other questions they may have about careers.
