

# Scholarships

There are many scholarships that are available to school leavers. It is up to you to do your research. Take note of closing dates for applications. In most circumstances, late applications will not be accepted or will be given low priority. Any requests for testimonials/references or academic transcripts must be made through Mr Mackenzie. House leaders generally complete the testimonials which are confidential and will not be shown to you. You must give your house leaders plenty of time to complete their part. Generally a minimum of 3 weeks before the closing date is needed.
