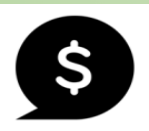

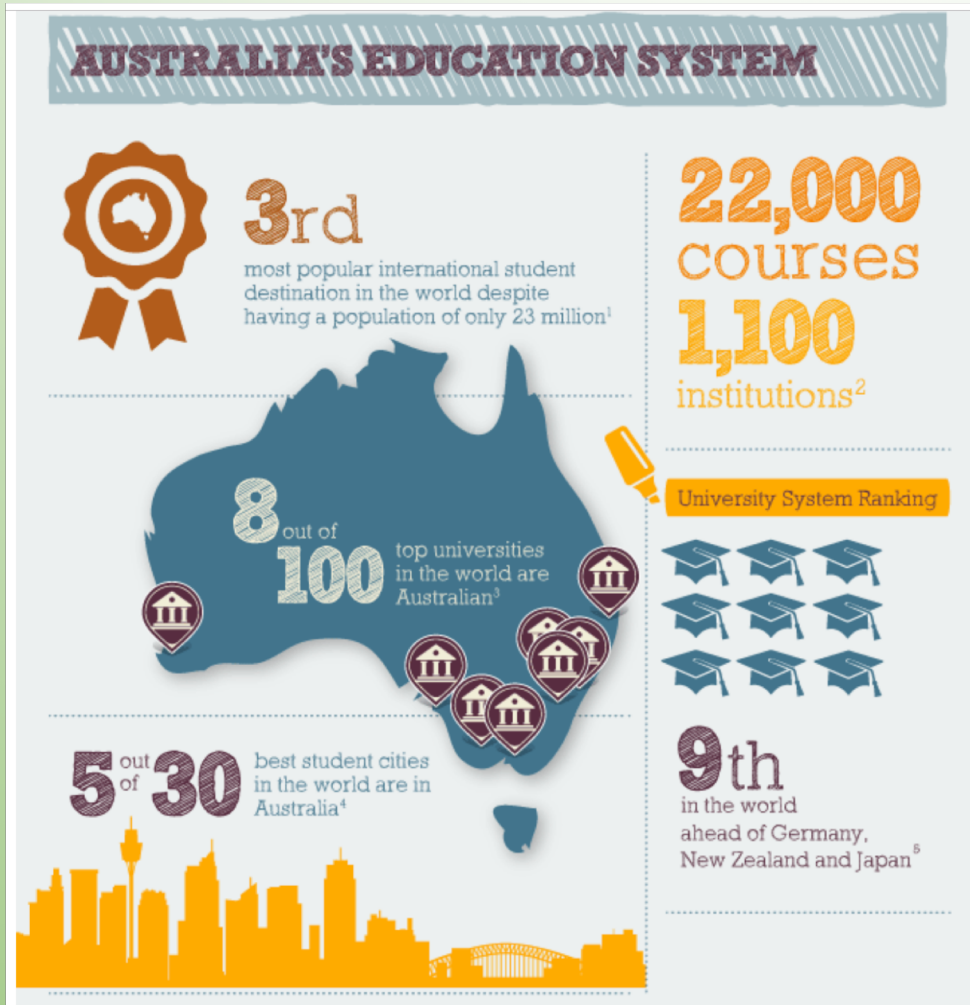

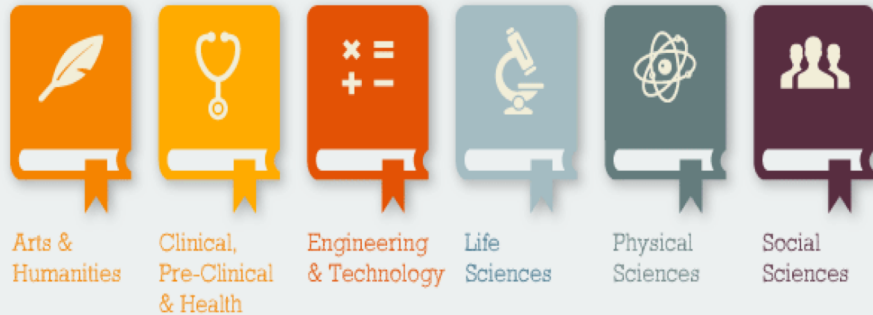

# Australian Education System

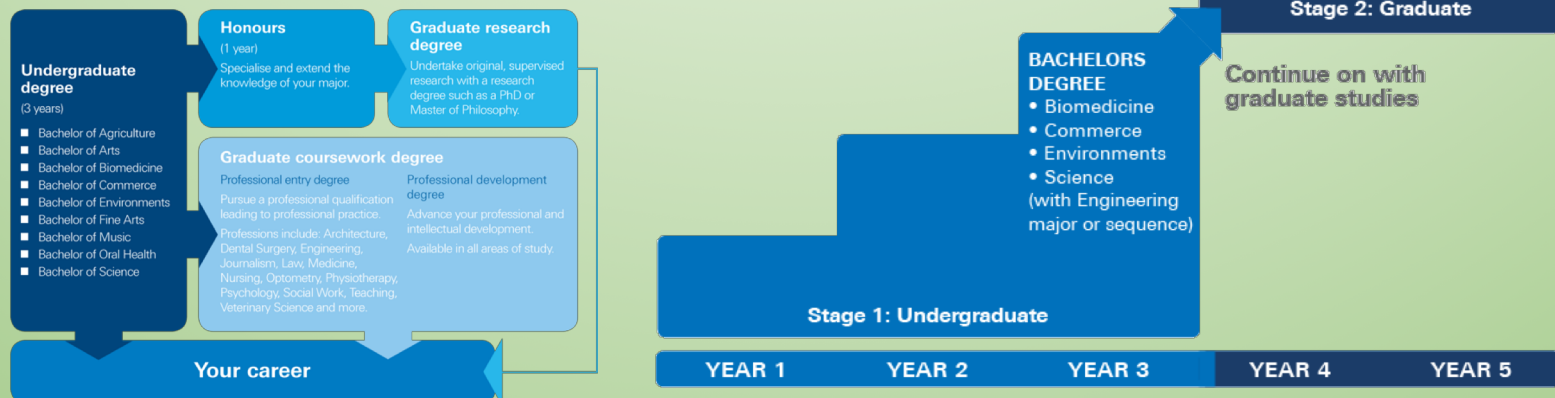


Undergraduate Degree Title	Duration
Bachelor Degree (General)	3 years full-time study
Bachelor Degree (Professional)	4 years full-time study (Direct Honours)
Bachelor Degree + Honours	3-4 years full-time + 1 additional year's successful completion allows entry to a research Masters or Doctorate

# Melbourne University

## The Melbourne Curriculum

- New approach to study implemented in 2008
- Students initially study a 'generalist' degree followed by a specialist Masters degree.
- Developed in accordance with European and North American degree structures
- Limited undergraduate degree options
- Broad number of postgraduate specialisations
- Adopted by other universities – including The University of Western Australia



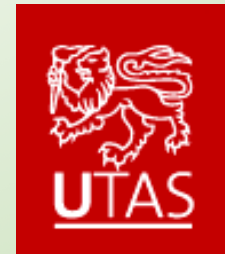
# Sydney University

## The Sydney Revamp 2018

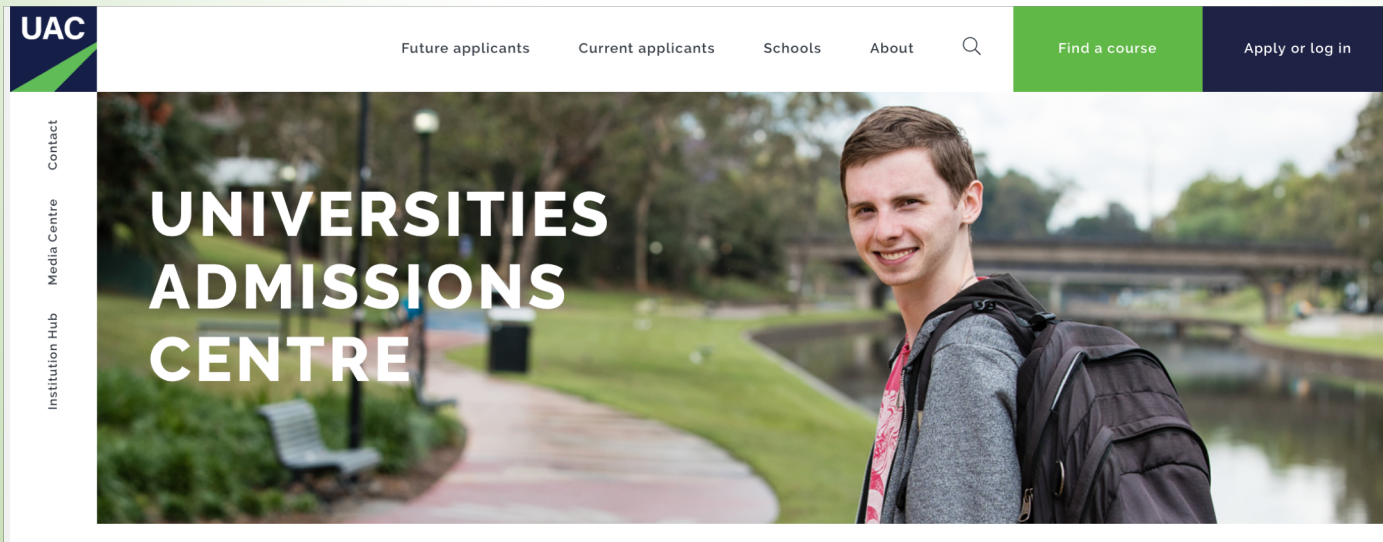
- New approach to study implemented in 2018
- simplified undergraduate offerings across liberal studies award courses in arts, science and commerce. These award courses have:
  - common definitions of course components (stream, program, major and minor)
  - common course structures in each award course.

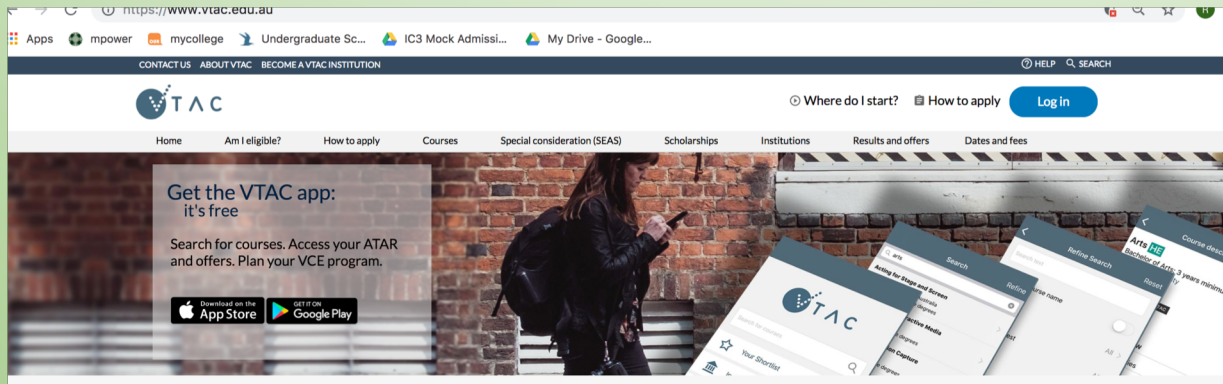

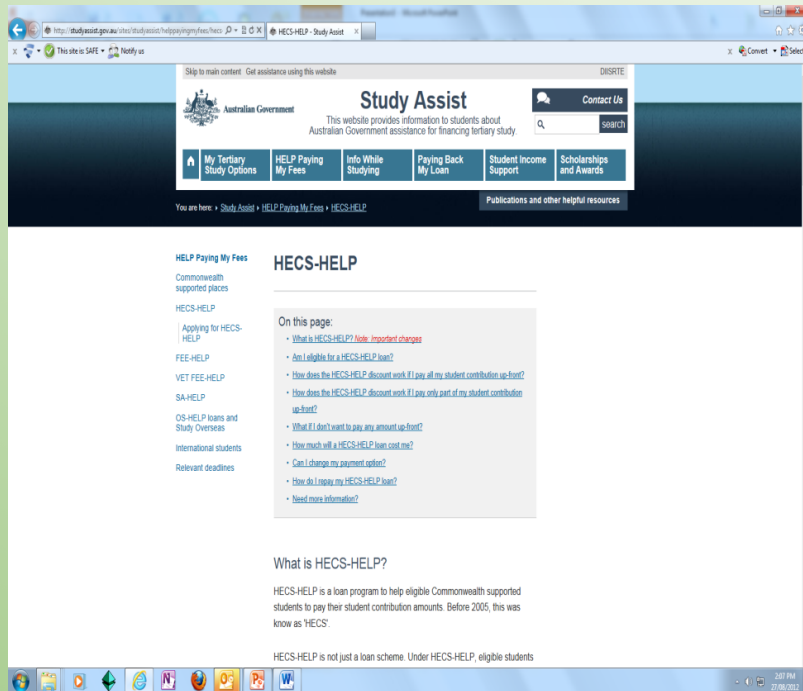
