IMPORTANT INFORMATION – Please read the following notes

1. Please circle your possible Scholarship column. Circle just one column regardless of whether you intend taking one or more Scholarship subjects. A senior staff member will see students who are successful with their application. Scholarship class lists will be confirmed after your CIE or NCEA results are finalised.
2. AS Accounting, AS Business and AS Economics. Students who wish to study all three of these subjects must obtain the approval of Mr Mackenzie, Year 13 Dean.
3. Students can only study a maximum of two of Art Painting, Art Design, Art Photography or Design Technology (Graphics) at AS or A Level in any one year. See Mr Mackenzie, Year 13 Dean. AS and A Level Graphics may be taught as a combined class.
4. A Level Chinese. This course is for speakers of Chinese as a first language and students are recommended to have equivalent of AS Chinese proficiency. Please note these classes are held before school.
5. A Level Further Mathematics. See Mr Buckley, Head of Faculty, Mathematics.
6. AS and A Level Music (1st and 2nd year). AS Music may be selected by any student who has completed IGCSE Music. A Level Music can only be selected by students continuing on from AS Music.
7. AS Japanese and Chinese. These courses will be timetabled with IGCSE and are offered subject to numbers. Students are recommended to have the equivalent of IG or above Japanese or Chinese proficiency.
8. A Level Spanish. This course will be timetabled with AS Spanish.
9. NCEA Level 2 English for University Entrance Literacy. Recommendation for this course will be given by Mrs Thompson.
10. Uni Mathematics (13MXX). See Head of Faculty Mathematics.

It is important at all levels to look ahead and make a careful and planned choice of subjects. Students have been provided with a **Course Selection Guide** designed to assist in this process. Please read this book and information on the school website BEFORE making your option choices.
