IMPORTANT INFORMATION – Please read the following notes

1. Shaded Courses *. These courses are not approved subjects for University Entrance. They may include a mixture of Achievement Standards and Unit Standards. Students selecting more than one of these courses must see Mr Mackenzie.
2. Please choose the Scholarship column if you wish to be considered for Scholarship. A senior staff member will see students who are successful with their application. Scholarship class lists will be confirmed after your CIE or NCEA results are finalised.
3. Level 3 Drama. This course may be timetabled with Level 2 Drama.
4. Students can only study a maximum of two of Level 3 Art Design, Art Painting, Art Photography and Design & Visual Communication. See Mr Mackenzie, Year 13 Dean.
5. Level 3 Textiles Design & Technology. This course will be timetabled with Level 2 Textiles Design & Technology.
6. Level 3 Music. This course may be timetabled with Level 1 and Level 2 Music.
7. Level 3 Māori. This course will be a combined course with Level 2 Māori.
8. Level 3 Chinese. This course will be a combined course with A Level Chinese and classes are held before school. It is a course for speakers of Chinese as a first language.
9. Level 3 Spanish. Students may be able to study Level 3 Spanish on a case by case basis. See Mr Rodriguez. This class will be combined with Cambridge Spanish.
10. Level 3 Robotics and Product Design. This course will be offered subject to numbers and may be a combined class with Level 2.
11. Level 2 Vocational Studies. Entry to this course is by selection. See Mrs Thompson, Year 12 Dean or Mrs Bushe, Careers Advisor.
12. Level 3 Dance. This course may be timetabled with Level 1 and Level 2.
13. Level 3 Digital Technologies Computing and Robotics & Product Design will be offered subject to numbers and may be a combined class with Level 1 and/or 2.

It is important at all levels to look ahead and make a careful and planned choice of subjects. Students have been provided with a **Course Selection Guide** designed to assist in this process. Please read this book and information on the school website BEFORE making your option choices.
