**IMPORTANT INFORMATION – Please read the following notes**

1. Most Year 10 subjects are open entry. The language subjects require some prior learning from Year 9.

You MAY BE able to pick up one or more of Chinese, Japanese, Spanish or Te Reo Māori if you have not studied them this year. You must see Mr Rodriguez.

Note: Japanese is offered in Year 11 subject to numbers and may be a combined class with AS Japanese.

2. Year 10 Technology.  
(Multi-Materials Technology, Textiles, Food Technology and Coding and Robotics).  
If you choose three of these subjects, the final decision on whether you are allowed to study three technologies will be made by Mr Phillips.
3. ESOL. Placement in this option will be by selection as a result of testing.
4. A supplementary English class will be offered to motivated students who have struggled with English in Year 9 and wish to improve their skills. These classes will be by selection as a result of testing.
5. IGCSE Mathematics will be offered to selected students by invitation.
6. Year 10 Future Problem Solving. Numbers may be limited. Students in the extension class (9THOR) cannot choose this subject.
7. Year 10 Music. You can only study one option of either Contemporary Music or Music Advanced.
8. Art and Creative Design. You can only study one option, of either Art or Creative Design.
